Allahabad State University, Allahabad Ordinance for Post Graduate Courses (Semester System)

1- Preamble

- 1.1 In order to regulate Post Graduate Semester System of University and affiliated colleges the following Ordinance is promulgated.
- 1.2 This ordinance shall come into effect from the date of approval by Academic Council for Post Graduate Courses (excluding Professional Courses).
- 1.3 This Ordinance may be called Allahabad State University Ordinance for Post Graduate Courses (Semester System)

2- Duration of Courses

- 2.1 These courses shall be of four Semesters in two academic sessions' duration.
- 2.2 The Odd Semester (First and Third Semester) shall be from July to December and Even Semester (Second and Fourth Semester) shall be from January to June.
- 2.3 At the end of Semester the candidate shall be required to present themselves for examination.

3- Admission

3.1 The admission to the Post Graduate Courses run in the Campus of University shall be on the basis of merit of written test provided the number of applicants for particular course shall be more than the prescribed seats. No admission test shall be held for those courses where number of applicants are less than the prescribed seats. In such courses, admission shall he done after examining applicant's eligibility prescribed by the University. In associated/affiliated colleges, the admission to the Post Graduate classes shall be on the basis of merit of marks obtained in graduation/qualifying examination.

- 3.2 Eligibility criterion for admission to PG courses shall be completed under graduate course in subject concerned in third year course with 10+2+3 system or equivalent course from any University/Institute recognized by University Grant Commission.
- 3.3 Candidates appearing in final year of under graduate course may also apply for admission test, but upto the date of admission date announced by university their under graduate course shall be completed.
- 3.4 Reservation of seats in admission shall he as per the notification of State Government issued from time-to-time/rules framed by university.
- 3.5 In case where number of available seats is less and candidates secure equal marks (percent) in admission test, the admission of the candidate shall be based upon securing higher marks in the relevant subject of the final year of the qualifying examination and where concerned subject is not available, the percentage of final year examination shall be taken into account.
- 3.6 A candidate can not pursue two full time post-graduate courses simultaneously.
- 3.7 Candidate applying for admission to more than one subject must apply on separate admission/application form for each subject.
- 3.8 University reserves the right to cancel any admission at any stage.
- 3.9 In case of any matter relating to the post graduate admissions, the decision of the Vice-Chancellor/Admission committee of University shall be final.
- 3.10 All the legal matters pertaining to the post-graduate admissions shall be subject to the Allahabad Jurisdiction only.
- 3.11 If in view of the university, sufficient number of application forms are not received in any course, in that situation the university reserves its right to cancel that course for that session.

4. Attendance

- Students are normally expected to attend 100 percent classes. However, no student shall be allowed to appear in the end semester examination unless he/she has put in at least 75 percent attendance during the course of instruction in each paper.
- The attendance in theory papers and practical/filed work sessions will be considered separately.
- The shortage of attendance not exceeding 15 percent of the total number of lectures delivered or practical/filed work done in each subject can be condoned for special reasons/conditions as below:
- 4.3.1. The Head of Department/Incharge course may condone a shortage of attendance upto 5 percent of the total of lectures delivered or practical/field work done in each subject.
- The Vice-Chancellor may condone further a shortage of attendance upto 10 percent on the recommendation of HOD/Incharge of course concerned. The candidate can avail the concession at most twice during the entire course.
- 4.3.3. The candidate who fails to fulfil the requirement of attendance as mentioned in clauses 4.1 and 4.2 shall be required to register in the same semester with new batch.

5. Number of papers:

In each course the number of papers per semester will be four followed by viva-voce at the end of each semesters.

- 6. Rules and Regulations for examination
- 6.1. Each paper of post-graduate course shall be of 100 marks, (including practical/project work/field work/Seminar or Viva-Voce of 100 marks.
- There shall be a semester end examination and each student has to appear in all papers including practical/project work/seminar or viva-voce.

- 6.3. A candidate shall be declared to have passed a semester if he/she has secured not less than 20% of maximum marks in each theory paper and each of his/her practical/project/field work/seminar/viva voce examination and also has secured not less than 36% marks in aggregate.
- 6.4. All those candidates who pass a semester examination (under clause 6.3 stated above) can appear for improvement in only one theory paper of a semester of the next back paper/regular examination of that semester and not thereafter. However, this improvement facility will not be given in practical/project work/filed work/seminar/viva-voce.
- 6.5. A candidate shall be declared to have passed a semester if he/she has secured less than 20% of maximum marks in each theory paper and has secured 36% marks or more marks in aggregate. Such candidates have to appear in those paper(s) in which they secured less than 20% marks in next examination of concerned semester as and when held and have to secure 20% of maximum marks in each paper.
- 6.6. A candidate shall be declared as pass in a semester if he/she has secured 20% or more of maximum marks in each theory paper but has failed to secure 36% of maximum marks in aggregate. Such candidates have to appear in maximum two papers of that semester in next examination of concerned semester as and when held and have to secure 36% of maximum marks in aggregate.
- 6.7. Student admitted in first year may attend classes of two semesters (first and second) of that year and appear in examinations of these semesters having minimum of 75% attendance in classes. In the same way, students, admitted in second year can attend classes of two semesters (third and fourth) and as per rules may appear in examinations.
- 6.8. After the examination of second year if any student fails to clear his/her back paper in any semester (first, second, third and fourth) then these students may appear in the examination of concerned semester to be

DON 9 1.1 20.717 85.77 39(7)24) 20.717 Proper Agence held in order and clear that back paper. This facility will be given only once to the students. However, if the student again fails to clear that back paper, he may appear in regular examination of concerned semester next year of as ex-student.

- Ex-student passed in examination of any semester of first or second 6.9. year will not appear in the examination of that semester. His/her marks of that semester will remain reserve which he/she has already passed.
- 6.10. If practical/vivo-voce/project work/field work examination of any semester has left, then one more opportunity will be given as per rules of the university.
- 6.11. The admission of student, who has not appeared in any paper of first semester, will automatically be treated as cancelled.
- 6.12. Student passed in First/Third semester but not appeared in the examination second/fourth semester may appear in examination after studying in second/fourth semester.
- 6.13. Result will be declared after combining total of marks secured by candidate in first and second year (All four semester) as per following norms:

First Division

: 60% of maximum marks or more

Second Division

: 48% of maximum marks or more but less than 60% of

maximum marks

Third Division

: 36% of maximum marks or more but less than 48% of

maximum marks.

7- Scrutiny

There will be provision of Scrutiny of marks obtained by examinee. For this, the examinee has to apply on prescribed format and deposit paper-wise fees prescribed by University. He/She may apply for Scrutiny within one month from the date of declaration of result.
